Title I Program Overview

- Title I is the largest federal education funding program for schools
- Schools qualify for Title I funds based on economic need of the school / community
- Title I funding may be used for interventions for students who are at risk of falling behind or are struggling to meet academic standards.



Title I Plan for PCA

Our school participates in a Title I Schoolwide Program.

- Schoolwide programs have flexibility in using their Title I funds in conjunction with other funds in the school in order to enhance instruction.
- School-wide programs must conduct a comprehensive needs assessment, identify and commit to specific goals and strategies that address those needs, create a comprehensive plan, and conduct an annual review of the effectiveness of the school-wide program that is revised as needed.
